## Course:

The course is an analysis of the genre of parables within the social, cultural, literary and religious context of Rabbinic Judaism. This course emphasizes the context of Yeshua's parables by comparing them to the Rabbinic Meshalim (parables).

Our introduction will survey the history of interpretation of the Parables of Yeshua. The literary structure of Parables/Meshalim will also be discussed. We will then survey and summarize the theology of the Parables of Yeshua and the theology of the Meshalim (Parables) of the Rabbis.

During our survey we will relate to points of similarity and difference between Yeshua's Parables and the Rabbinic Meshalim.

Finally, we will summarize the practical implications for understanding the teachings of Yeshua's Parables for our theology and life.
